**TITLE:** Clinical Supervisor

**DUTIES:** Under the direction of the Vice President, Violence Intervention and Prevention, the Clinical Supervisor will provide clinical supervision to A New Day, the sexual assault program, and actively participate in long range planning and development of goals and objectives.

- Provide clinical supervision to staff, volunteers and masters level clinical interns.
- Assist in the development of plans to increase access of mental health services for high risk populations.
- Implement and monitor culturally competent therapeutic treatment to trauma victims.
- Ensure communication with client support systems and referral sources for client progress.
- Administer accurate and appropriate documentation statistics and quality assurance.
- Attend staff, agency and community meetings as required.
- Work with other managers and Director to ensure coverage for all components of service throughout VIP.
- Other duties as assigned.

**REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS:** Bilingual – Cape Verdean Creole, Haitian Creole, Portuguese, and/or Spanish. Must be a licensed, Master’s level clinician with at least three (3) years of experience in providing outpatient behavioral health services to youth and families. Experience with or demonstrated understanding of populations at high risk for sexual assault and domestic violence. Experience working with trauma survivors and/or survivors of interpersonal violence. Experience working with substance abuse, serious mental illness, homelessness and/or sex trafficking issues and populations. Ability to maintain flexible schedule in accordance with program needs; i.e. some evenings and/or emergency responses may be required. Ability to work with a diverse population and staff. Travel is required. A valid driver’s license, registration, auto insurance and a safe driving record are a must.

**PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:** Trained and experienced in trauma informed evidence based therapies such as: Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing (EMDR), Trauma Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (TFCBT), Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT), exposure therapy, art therapy, and body center therapy.
